# **School Uniform**



We would like to remind you of our expectations surrounding uniform and PE kit. For the colder months, children may wear trousers, culottes, a pinafore dress or skirt (grey or black), which should not be too short or tight fitting; a red, white or grey blouse or polo shirt; a red sweatshirt or cardigan (this can be branded with the school logo or plain); red, white, grey or black socks or tights and flat, black shoes (no boots or trainers).

The following items are not acceptable as school uniform– cycling shorts, leggings, tracksuit bottoms, jogging bottoms and sports shorts. Children are also not permitted to wear any make-up or nail varnish. Jewellery should not be worn but a watch and one pair of **plain** stud earrings is permitted.

Please also ensure that uniform is marked with your child's name.

Children in Years 5 and 6, are asked to come to school dressed in the correct PE kit (suitable for the weather) but wearing their **school jumper** and **school shoes**. They should bring their plimsolls or trainers to change into before the lesson. This not only promotes good hygiene by not getting their school shoes sweaty during exercise, but helps keep the school clean if they have been doing outdoor PE on the sometimes muddy field.
