# Year 6 Autumn 2023

It has been a different start to the school year but the Year 6 team are really pleased with how well the children have settled into the new routines.

This term much of our learning will be linked to the history theme of 'Crime and Punishment.' In our history sessions, we will learn about how crime and punishment has changed over the past 800 years from Medieval Britain all the way to Modern Society.

Our science topics include 'Living things and their Habitats' where the children learn how to classify animals and plants and 'Light' where the investigate shadows and refraction.

In design technology, the children will be drawing upon their sewing skills to design and make a mobile phone case. In computing, they will be learning how to create webpage. In art, they will be taking inspiration from the natural world to create reduction print. In P.E, the children will dance, play basketball, tag rugby and perform gymnastic routines.


## English


In English this year, we will be using CUSP (Curriculum with Unity Schools Partnership) to extend the children's knowledge and enjoyment of a range of genres. This term our focus will be autobiographies, discursive writing and speeches, poetry, first person stories with a moral, Shakespeare's sonnets and explanations. Some of these units will also link to other curriculum areas.

## Reading

During our guided reading sessions, the children will be taking part in whole class reading activities. Over the term, each class will read 'The Bridge to Terabithia' by Katherine Paterson, 'Holes' by Louis Sachar and 'The Highwayman' by Alfred Noyes.







#### **Mathematics**

During the Autumn term, we will revisit key mathematical knowledge and skills such as place value and the four operations before moving onto fractions and decimals. We will also develop the children's confidence in mental arithmetic and problem solving throughout the term.

We ask that you do not use any of the previous SATs papers with your children as these will be used in school for practise and assessment purposes.

#### Homework

#### Spelling

We are now using CUSP spelling in lessons. This involves three 15-minute sessions each week with morning work to consolidate this learning. There will be no spelling homework/spelling lists sent home.

#### Times Table Rockstars

It is incredibly important that the children are fluent with all the multiplication facts. Please encourage your child to practise their times tables for 10-15 minutes a day.

## Reading

We are also encouraging children to read on a regular basis (25 minutes per day). Your child will have received their new ZPD and this year we are continuing with reading targets, which are linked to Accelerated Reader. This 'points target' is personalised to your child and is linked to their reading ability. When your child has read a book, they are able to complete a quiz, and this allows them to earn points. Each half term, there will be one year group winner and they will receive a book of their choice. We are continuing with our 'reading for pleasure' sessions in school but these are in addition to reading at home.

# SATs

According to the latest government guidance, KS2 SATs will take place in the week beginning Monday 13<sup>th</sup> May 2024. Children will sit the Key Stage 2 SATs tests in Reading, SPAG and Maths. Writing in **all subjects** will be assessed by class teachers throughout the academic year. Please note our work towards the end of Key Stage 2 assessments is **ongoing from September**, however our primary focus will be that children settle back into school before any mention of SATs!

#### PE lessons

Monday afternoon — indoor PE. Thursday afternoon — outdoor PE.

On PE days, children should continue to come to school wearing their white PE top along with their PE shorts or black/navy/grey jogging bottoms (dependent on the weather) and their school jumper. They should wear their normal school shoes and bring suitable P.E footwear to change into. Long hair must be tied back and all jewellery removed. If your child cannot take part in a PE, they must have a signed note from home.

## Appropriate clothing

Please can you ensure your child is coming to school appropriately dressed. As the weather becomes cooler, they will need a coat for break times. During the cold weather, children may wear an extra layer of clothing, but their red school jumper or cardigan must be their top layer.





# Trips

This term, there are lots of exciting trip opportunities.

#### 16th October - Crucial Crew

Crucial Crew is a national scheme that has been run by Ipswich Borough Council's Community Safety Team since 1994.

The aim of Crucial Crew is to provide a fun and stimulating environment for children to learn to:

- become more aware of personal safety.
- learn how to react correctly to dangerous and threatening situations.
- understand the role the emergency support services play and how and when to contact them.
- be aware of their own actions and the safety of others.

# 17th/18th/19th October -The Hold

During our visit to The Hold, the children will have the opportunity to study historical sources, maps, directories and census records, taking a hands-on approach in the education room. The Hold provides lots of activities that will immerse the children in how Crime and Punishment was dealt with in Ipswich in the past as well as showing them how professional historians and archivists' work. This programme has been curated especially for Broke Hall children, making it a truly bespoke experience.
