Reading

English

Throughout the term, we will continue to extend the children's knowledge and enjoyment of a range of genres including:

- Narrative written in third person
- Non-chronological report
- Instructions
- First person narrative descriptions
- Performance poetry



Maths

Whilst building on prior knowledge from the autumn term, this term the children will also learn:

- Unit 6 Multiplication and division
- Unit 7 Length and perimeter
- Unit 8 Fractions
- Unit 9 Mass
- Unit 10 Capacity



History

Next half term, we will begin learning about Romans. This topic will be split into two parts, our Spring Term focus will be on the Roman Empire.



Science

This term during their science lessons, the children will be learning about 'Animals, including Humans'. They will learn about the importance of a healthy, balanced diet, so this is the perfect opportunity to remind you that children are only allowed fruit or vegetables as their playtime snack.

After half term, we will be learning about 'Plants'. As part of this learning, we will be visiting Rushmere Heath on Thursday 14th March - a letter will be sent out in due course with further details.

Handwriting and Presentation

This term, we will continue to focus on our handwriting and presentation. Please ensure whenever your child completes any learning at home, they do so, using a sharp pencil and a ruler where necessary.

Children are encouraged to not use a rubber, but instead to cross out neatly with a single line.

All handwriting should be joined in line with our PenPals handwriting scheme.

P.E. and Games

This half term, indoor PE will be taught by Mrs Newland on a Wednesday morning.

3F and 3C will have their outdoor PE on Mondays, whilst 3SH will have theirs on a Tuesday.

Whilst the weather is cold, please ensure your child has a warm jumper and tracksuit bottoms to wear outside during PE.

We also ask that earrings are not worn on these days. If earrings do need to be worn, then the children need to bring in tape to cover them.



Geography

This half term, our geography learning will focus on 'Volcanoes and Earthquakes'. The children will learn about the formation of the Earth and how this can cause earthquakes and volcanoes, locating them on maps.



Homework

Following the success of last half-term's 'bingo' homework, children have been given a new set of activities linked to their learning this term. We ask that a minimum of one activity is completed a week. Children should bring in their blue homework books on Monday mornings for these to be checked by their class teacher and will be returned home by the following day.

TT Rockstars

In preparation for their statutory multiplication check in Year 4, children are asked to practise their times-tables as part of learning at home; TT Rockstars and mathsframe give them a method to practise in an interactive way. Their times tables will be monitored by the class teacher. Children have been given log-in details for TT Rockstars and these can be found on their reading records.
