## Birthday lunches are back!

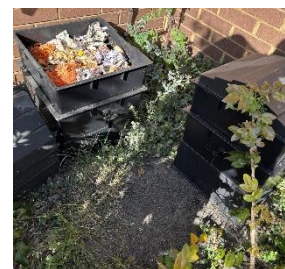
